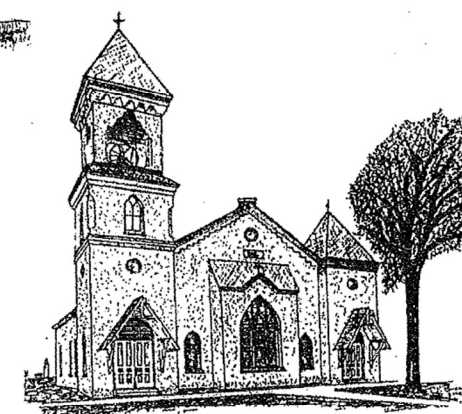
ANNOUNCEMENTS
