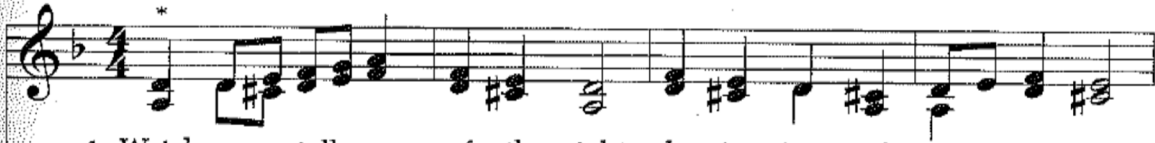


Watchman, Tell Us of the Night 97
