For some, Spring is the end of wintertime fun, like sledding, skiing, snowboarding, and the start of regular floor cleaning, thanks to all the mud.

However, I'm betting most reading this newsletter are singing a completely different tune—done with the cold, dark weather and depressing days. Done with cocooning indoors and struggling to stay warm. Done with the barren, dormant landscape—and ready to see some green, hear the birds, and feel some sunshine!

Auctioneers kicked off Lancaster County's mud sales at the Strasburg Sale Friday, Feb. 21st.

These events, similar to church life, serve as community gatherings. Each one is a chance to both donate things you don't want and find a deal. Plus, every sale has plenty of food.

The Bart Spring Mud Sale was Feb. 28-March 1. Pequea Valley's Mud Sale took place March 7-8 at the Gordonville Fire Station and the Gap Mud Sale, March 21-22. Along with a string of others throughout Lancaster County and beyond, Kinzer's is yet to come June 6-7.

Along with the sunrise and spring rains, mud is a welcome signal that the ground has softened and a fresh crop of fruits and vegetables are about to be in season, including lettuces, spinach, kale, artichokes, asparagus an array of citrus and more.

As a church, we can ask: "Where is the soft ground with the potential for a promising crop?" Where are rays of light shining on new opportunities and realities?

Easter sunrise has been a cherished tradition at Leacock for many years. While we can't guarantee a breathtaking view every Easter due to unpredictable weather, we can promise the warmth and unity of a community coming together. We give witness to hope springing to life among us even when we are unsure of the future or are discouraged. We gather to celebrate and give witness to the resurrection.

Worship at Leacock is open to everyone! And we encourage a good turnout at every gathering.

Don't let your disappointments and grievances, your frustration with others, keep you away.

While a sunrise is a fleeting masterpiece, painted across the sky for only a few precious moments, it reminds us that each morning is a gift—filled with possibility, glowing with hope.

Lenten Worship

As we travel together on our Lenten journey, we need to take time to reflect on where we are going and why. From the solemn reminder of our mortality on Ash Wednesday, we have moved to a deeper contemplation of God's great love for us, God's mercy, God's grace — all expressed through the life and death of Jesus.



Each Sunday morning we have the opportunity to meet together to praise, to meditate, to consider, to reflect, to hear God's Word to us and for us.

Yet as we draw closer to Holy Week, the most sacred time of our liturgical year, we need to acknowledge our frailty, our vulnerability, our utter dependence on God's love and grace. How can we participate more fully in Christ's redemptive act?

Thursday April 17, Maundy Thursday, we are invited and encouraged to gather at 7:00 p.m. in the sanctuary to worship, to reflect, to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion as we bear witness to Jesus' Great Commandment: Love one another.

Good Friday the church will be open from noon until 1:00 p.m. for us to drop in (or stay the whole hour) for a time of music and the Word. May our Lenten journey be one of renewal and rediscovery as together we recommit ourselves as disciples of Jesus.

Easter Dawn Service

Our Easter Dawn Service will be held at 7:00 a.m. at Old Leacock. Come gather around the fire in the courtyard, light a candle, and sing "Alleluia! He Is Risen, He Is Risen Indeed!"

Psalm 113:3 ESV

From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the Lord is to be praised!

Genesis 1:14 ESV

And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night. And let them be for signs and for seasons, and for days and years.

Luke 1:78-79 ESV

Because of the tender mercy of our God, whereby the sunrise shall visit us from on high to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."

2 Samuel 23:4 ESV

God dawns on them like the morning light, like the sun shining forth on a cloudless morning, like rain that makes grass to sprout from the earth.

Malachi 4:2 ESV

But for you who fear my name, the sun of righteousness shall rise with healing in its wings. You shall go out leaping like calves from the stall.
