

This morning we welcome **Pastor Nering Huete** to the pulpit. He was born in Honduras and is an Honorably Retired Minister of the Presbyterian U.S.A. since 2017.

He came to the U.S. with his family to be a Pastor of a Lancaster Spanish Mennonite congregation in 1984. After 5 years, he received a call from the PA Council of Churches (with whom the Presbyterian Church was very active) to develop a Chaplaincy Ministry among the Spanish speaking Immigrants of Chester County. After eleven years, Pastor Huete was Parish associate of Memorial Presbyterian Church in Lancaster and Church Planter in Chester County. He was the Organizing and first pastor of LA IGLESIA PRESBITERIANA DE TOUGHKENAMON for seventeen years.
