"First Coming" by Madeleine L'Engle, American writer and poet - born 1918.

Lighting the First Candle: Hope

Lighting the Second Candle: Peace

Or was it Plan A? Did you always plan to come, whatever happened?

Lighting the Third Candle: Joy

Would you have come to a good world where most of the time we loved our neighbors and kept your laws?

Lighting of the Fourth Candle: Love

Or did you come because our world is full of violence and despair and only you can make it right? God, our wondering is not disrespect but a way of saying, "Wow!" and "Thank You!" because the true wonder is, the wonderful truth is, that you did come, and that your Word became flesh, and lived among us, full of grace and truth, full of conviction and love.
