Greeting and Welcome

Call to Worship

Leader: We have welcomed the Christ child and declared that the glory of God’s salvation has come near.

Leader: Come, let us worship God, whose love endures from generation to generation, guiding us from one year to the next.

People: Come, let us worship as we live in anticipation of God’s kingdom on earth as it is heaven.
